Judy is the great, great, great granddaughter of Dr. Richmond and Dede is the great, great, great granddaughter of Chloe Clark. They got to meet each other on Sunday October 8, at Dede's book talk and signing in the DuPont Museum. Dede's book, *My Music Man*, is about 6 generations of her father's side of the family which begin with the marriage of Chloe Clark and William Willson. While the Mission site was only active for a couple of years, they played an important role in the history of current day DuPont.
